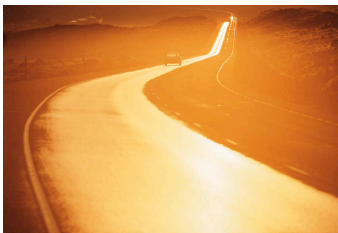
There will be a picnic in August thanks to the committee of Cookie Lough, Rosemary Gapa, Nancy Neff, and Carrie Weber.
