Annual Picnic Update ..... by the 2022 Picnic Committee

At the May meeting of the Prime Timers, the picnic committee for 2021 recommended that if we were to have a picnic in 2022, a committee be established to determine if this event could be catered and if it were, to determine the cost of this event. This recommendation was made due to the amount of planning and physical labor involved for this event and the lack of volunteers for set up and clean up in 2021. Therefore, a committee of 4 was formed and the following information was obtained from local caterers. Reulands, Camps, Thunderbird and Knockers were called. When talking with the caterers, we were projecting between 40-50 attendees. The following amounts were received: Reulands in the \$15 - \$20 range; Knockers also in this price range, Camps and Thunderbird responded to the quote of 100 pieces of chicken (the committee thinking 50 attendees with each person allowed two pieces of chicken gave them an estimate of 100 pieces of chicken - both were estimating \$200 with no delivery; and subway's on line price for a platter serving seven people was a cost of \$53.39 (you do the math)). The membership unanimously voted not to brown bag it and it was decided signup sheets would be put out at the July meeting for food, clean up, and volunteers, basically indicating if the membership wanted a picnic we would all have to pitch in. Everyone agreed they would be happy to bring a dish to pass as we have done in previous years but in addition there will be signup sheets, indicating the membership's commitment and involvement for set up (moving tables, washing tables, and bringing bingo material to the pavilion, etc.) and take down (moving tables back after bingo, clean up, sweep pavilion and bringing bingo material back to storeroom etc.). As we have done in the past, everyone will bring their own beverage, dishes, serving/eating utensils, dinnerware, and napkins. A decision will be made at the July meeting if we will in fact continue to have this event based on the results of the set-up and take down sign-up sheets. Again, I want to say we are sorry this is so lengthy – but this was the direction given us at the June membership meeting. We honestly don't know if we've covered all bases and answered all questions but in the short time provided – we honestly tried.



Dragon Boat Update

As you all know, the Prime Timers will be sponsoring the food court again this year for the Dragon Boat Festival. Due to Covid restrictions, 2019 was the last Dragon Boat Festival and PrimeTimers are sponsoring we are looking forward to the 2022 being a huge success. First off, I want to say a big THANK YOU to all our members who have given their time and volunteered for this event, and I want to let everyone know what the proceeds will be used for in 2022. As you may recall, in years past proceeds went to benefit the Aspirus Tick-Borne Illness Center and Autism Services. These proceeds will also help create a chemotherapy infusion center within HYMC to offer patient services close to home in a comforting dedicated suite. This investment will be matched by the new hospital owner, Aspirus Health, doubling the impact of every donation. We can all be proud of the work we're doing to better medical services in our area and again, thank you one and all for your dedication to this project.
